**ADVICE FOR VETERANS ON DRESS FOR REGT EVENTS V2 – updated 16 Feb 20**

1. This note has been written to help to answer questions about what our veterans should wear to Regt events.
  
2. Retired member of the Regt would not usually wear uniform for Regt events. The informal advice below is based on common practice and is not intended in any way to be a strict dress code. The Regt's priority is for our veterans to feel welcome at their Regt events, and is not about what our veterans wear. Veterans are encouraged to contact RHQ if they have any questions.

<b>2</b>	No. 2, 4 and 6 Dress (Service Dress)	Suit, Blazer with Regimental Tie or Day Dress	Medals are commonly worn for Regt Parades, Regt Services and Remembrance Services. Regt Berets may be worn for Regt Parades. Regt Blazer Badges may be worn.
<b>3</b>	No. 7, 8, 9 Dress (Working/Combat Dress)	Suit, Blazer with Regt Tie or Day Dress	Regt Berets may be worn for Regt Parades incl veterans working as volunteers in our Museums.
<b>4</b>	No. 10 and 11 Dress (Mess Dress)	Black Tie/Dinner Jacket, Suit with Regt Tie or Evening Dress	Miniature medals may be worn Regt (No 11 Dress) Cumberbund may be worn
<b>5</b>	No 13 and 15 Dress (Barrack Dress)	Suit, Blazer with Regt Tie or Day Dress	-
