Cambridgeshire Army Cadet Force. The parade was followed by a service in the Cathedral that saw the laying up Queens Colour of the 6th and 3rd Battalion and also marked the centenary of the Battle of the Somme, including the Cambridgeshire Regiments action on the Schwaben Redoubt, the service was conducted by the Dean of Ely Cathedral and the Bishop of Ely gave the address. On conclusion of the service we all retired to the Lady Chapel for light refreshments and an address from the Colonel in Chief.

The Somme Remembered

On the 100th anniversary of the Battle of the Somme the July monthly service at the Regimental Chapel Warley was used to commemorate the Service and sacrifice of those who lost their lives in the battle and to reflect upon the human cost of conflict.

We were joined by the Lord Lieutenant and the normal monthly congregations ranks were swelled with attendance from 3 (Essex & Hertfordshire) Company and A Company (Essex) Company.
