1st Battalion (The Vikings)

Vikings Range Far and Wide through the Autumn Months

The Vikings have continued their busy period with much of the battalion deployed on a wide variety of tasks. A (Norfolk) Coy continue their Op Interflex task in the UK, B (Suffolk) Coy have exercised across Cyprus on Ex Suffolk Soldier, and C Coy have continued on Op Kipion in Bahrain and Op Timbern in Cyprus. Finally, D Coy have continued their deployment to Saudi Arabia, conducting a number of Short Term Training Teams and also represented the Battalion on the Cypriot Patrol Competition and the Cambrian Patrol Competition.

Vikings Provide Short Term Training in Saudi Arabia

In October 2022, a select few members from the 1st Battalion had the fantastic opportunity to deploy to Saudi Arabia on a Short-Term Training Team (STTT) as part of the enduring British Military Mission which has been there for the past 15 years. 12 Vikings, comprising of Officers and Junior / Senior NCOs, deployed to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA) on Oct 1st 2022, charged with three separate tasks in three separate locations. Having split into three teams of four, we met our British Military Mission advisors in Jeddah, Dammam and Riyadh.

The four-man team in Riyadh were tasked with designing and running a course for 36 SANG NCOs, ranging from Cpl to SSgt. The team had three main objectives; Develop their leadership, improve their Skill at Arms and marksmanship, and develop their Core Skills. The end state to achieve was for them to improve across all these areas and also develop their instructional abilities so they could return to their units and share the knowledge learnt.

The KSA West STTT team deployed in support of the 2nd SS Bde, who are based close to the coastal city of Jeddah. Capt Jake Bamford, Sgt Nathan Anderson, Sgt James Quelch and Cpl Domm Wood were tasked with delivering an NCO leadership development course over nine weeks, similar to the STTT team in Riyadh.

To the East, a team of 4 was sent to Dammam to deliver a 6-week Counter-Terrorism Course to 3SSB. The team, comprising of Capt Andrews, Sgt Davitt, Sgt McAleese and Cpl Bancroft, were charged with instructing the course of 24 SANG NCOs the complexities of CT Ops including urban operations, marksmanship and detainee handling.

The experience had by all was overwhelmingly positive. Each team has a newfound understanding of the Saudi culture and how our militaries differ and relate. Short Term Training Teams such as these are undoubtably some of the best opportunities that the British Army has to offer currently; deploying in small teams away from the organic Chain of Command (CoC) with all the inherent responsibilities that entails, to deliver high quality training to an ally nation as part of the wider Defence Engagement programme HM Forces seeks to project across the Middle East. The STTT will be a highlight in the careers for many of those that deployed, which sets a positive tone as the battalion prepares to transition to the Security Force Assistant Brigade (SFAB) in the coming years with plenty more opportunities for similar deployments.

Exercise Cambrian Patrol 2022

In October the Vikings entered a team on Exercise Cambrian Patrol 2022, the British Army's premier patrols exercise. Cambrian Patrol is physically and mentally demanding, challenging individual and team military skills over difficult terrain in inclement weather conditions.



In Aug 2022 Team Manager CSgt Alan Taylor and Patrol Commander Capt Daniele Kitchen, created a team and began a rigorous training programme with the Cypriot Team from 33rd Special Forces Battalion. The Team trained alongside the Cypriots on the Troodos Mountain ranges and on the Episkopi and Dhekelia training areas.

November 2022

Sgt Alan Urwin headed up a training team delivering lessons on a range of subjects including Vehicle Recognition, Mine Clearance and CBRN. His assistance was invaluable in preparing the team. The team also received medical training that was ably delivered by LCpl Roslyn Mackie. The Vikings joined the 33rd Battalion on their final Patrol Ex. This involved a demanding climb of the Troodos Mountain range over two days, conducting military stands in a similar fashion to Cambrian Patrol. This joint training forged a strong bond between the two teams.



The Viking and Cypriot Team began Cambrian Patrol on the 13 October starting in the Brecon Beacons. The team completed the initial march at a fast pace scoring highly on the Orders and Medical stand. The team scored well on the tactical phase too, and covered a distance of circa 65 Km in 48 hours.

The Viking and Cypriot Patrol earned a silver medal at CP22. Whilst disappointing not the get the gold, a silver medal is still an excellent achievement and testament to the hard work and dedication of the team over the preceding 7 weeks. The Viking team can now look forward to conducting further training with our Cypriot partners.

Poachers Join the Leicester Tigers for Remembrance



Soldiers and Officers of B 'Leicestershire' Company of the Second Battalion, The Royal Anglian Regiment (The Poachers), gathered for a Service of Remembrance to unveil the Leicester Tigers Foundation monument which commemorates the Leicester Tigers players and soldiers that have fallen in conflict.

The event saw a gathering of local people, veterans of the regiment and representatives from Leicester Tigers and former England Captain, Rory Underwood MBE.

The monument celebrates the lives of the 54 Leicester Tigers players who lost their lives in conflict and acknowledging longstanding links with the armed services has been unveiled at the club's iconic home.

The Leicester Tigers Foundation Monument, installed on the plaza between the Tigers' Mattioli Woods Welford Road stadium and the new Hotel Brooklyn, features a bronze tiger head on a four-metre column carrying the names of the past players.

It also recognises the close ties between the Leicestershire Regiment and the Tigers since the club's formation in 1880, displaying the names of its players who served and survived. Peter Wheeler, former Leicester Tigers captain and director, and a Past President of the Rugby Football Union, performed the Monument's official unveiling with guests from the game of rugby, the military and the local community.

Lt Matt Willman and Sgt Cobbold of B (Leicestershire) Company represented the 2nd Battalion at the service, both were hugely impressed by the striking new memorial. All present thought it a fitting tribute to those from the Tigers community that have lost their lives.

Leicestershire Regiment representatives included Major General Anthony Pollard CBE DL, Lieutenant-Colonel Anthony Swallow OBE and Captain Bob Allen MBE, alongside Leicester Tigers Foundation trustee Vice Lord-Lieutenant Murray Colville; the Revd Canon Emma Davies, the Canon Precentor and Canon Residentiary at Leicester Cathedral, who led the ceremony and provided a blessing; and Monument sponsor Ian Mattioli MB
